Highlands

The largest region in the area, varies from rounded , firm and dry. Western Highlands Scotches tend to have a mild peatiness, Northern Highlands exhibit a more heathery and spicy character. Eastern Highlands Scotches are characteristically fruity.

Lowlands

These single malts are very soft–spoken, lightish and quaffable. Lowland malt whiskies are light bodied, relatively sweet and delicate.

There is only one distillery on the Isle of Skye; Talisker. A lonely and secretive figure, but one that produces a sweet, seaweedy nose, and a spicy long finish. They only make a 10 Year.

SMALL BATCH BOURBON

Whiskey, which defined means a distilled liquor made from a fermented mash of grains. Although all bourbon is whiskey, not all whiskey is bourbon. By law, to be called a straight bourbon whiskey, the mash bill must contain at least 51 percent corn, be distilled at no more than 160 proof and aged in new, charred oak barrels for a minimum of two years. Small Batch Bourbons represent the ultimate bourbon whiskey, with all of our selections having collected numerous awards and accolades.

BAKERS 7YR.....107 PROOF

Nose: Sweet, buttery caramel, stone fruit, and nut aromas.

Taste: A rich entry leads to a spicy, off-dry full-bodied palate with vibrant toffee, brown spice, and white pepper flavors.

Finish: Finishes with a lingering wave of sweet vanilla and wood spice.

BASIL HAYDEN'S 8YR.....80 PROOF

Nose: Sweet corn, toffee, nuts and charred wood aromas have a lean edge.

Taste: Round, vibrant entry leads to a dry medium-to full-bodied palate with somewhat lean oak, corn, and caramel flavors.

Finish: Finishes with a warm wave of toffee, spice, and drying wood.

BOOKERS 7-8YR.....121-127 PROOF

Nose: Toffee and earthy, oily roasted peanut.

Taste: A rich entry leads to a vibrant off-dry full-bodied palate with toasted coconut, toffee, dried fruit, brown spice, white pepper, and wood polish flavors.

Finish: Finishes with a chewy tannic fade of rich spice and dried fruits.

ELIJAH CRAIG 18YR.....96 PROOF

Nose: Subtle. Nutty. Almonds.

Taste: Light-bodied for this distillery. Firm, smooth, almost slippery. Lots of flavour development. Sweet, then smoky.

Finish: Rounded. Appetizing.

EVAN WILLIAMS, 1993.....86 PROOF

Nose: Sweet buttered caramel corn and earthy aromas.

Taste: A soft entry leads to a dry light-to medium-bodied palate with honeyed tea and angular rye spiciness.

Finish: Drying, somewhat green wood and white pepper.

Small Batch Bourbon Continued

EZRA BROOKS 12YR.....101 PROOF

Nose: Honey, wildflowers and clover.

Taste: A medium to full body with a rich sweetness of vanilla, honey and a hint of chocolate.

Finish: warm and not too long.

HENRY MCKENNA 10YR.....100 PROOF

Nose: There is a peppery pinch to the spicy nose, which fits perfectly with the dark brooding nature of the beast. The slightly singed toast acts as a perfect counter to the mint and orange rind. Really complex and tempting.

Taste: Wow! Loads of everything. As you might expect from the nose. A deep, satin-smooth oak and burnt sugar backdrop allows the malt and rye to have a big say. Lots of vanilla, too.

Finish: Here, as it dries, the corn comes into dominance. Some vanilla toffee, too

KNOB CREEK 7YR.....100 PROOF

Nose: Vanilla and caramel fudge, licorice, peanut, and wet wood.

Taste: Round entry leads to a smooth dryish medium-full to-bodied palate with brown sugar, spicy rye, licorice and brown spice flavors.

Finish: Somewhat lean and tannic wood spice fade.

WOODFORD RESERVE 18YR.....90.4 PROOF

Nose: Pronounced oak, softened by fruity rye and gentle vanilla. A little toffee and honey.

Palate: Big, big lift off with a powerful oaky-rye surge and an immediate arrival of spice. Toasty toward the middle with the corn arriving late on.

Finish: Long, cocoa and oak finale, burnt toast with a spread of honey

American Whiskey

American whiskies are all-grain spirits that have been produced from a mash bill that usually mixes together corn, rye, wheat, barley and other grains in different proportions, and then generally aged for an extended period of time in wooden barrels. These barrels may be new or used, and charred or uncharred on the inside, depending on the type of whiskey being made.

Gin

Rum

Rum distinguishes itself from other spirits by the plant from which it is made. Sugar cane, a member of the grass family has its origins in Papau New Guinea but this hearty plant is grown in tropical climes around the world. The sweet juice of the mature plant is extracted by pressing the hard stalk in mechanical mills.

Some distilleries use this fresh juice while others use the by-product of the sugar refining process known as molasses as the raw material for the fermentation process.

On top of the white rums, there are golden and dark rums. These are aged rums, that age over a period of one to thirty years, making it one of the most varied of the distilled spirits. Dark rums are aged in old scotch or whiskey barrels. This process also allows the rum to mellow over time.

A product of Mexico. True tequila is a product of the blue agave plant. The sap is collected from these plants and distilled in the district surrounding Tequila, Mexico. Gold tequila is aged in used scotch barrels to impart a golden color.

Blended Scotch

The Gaelic “*usquebaugh*”, meaning “Water of Life”, phonetically became “usky” and then “whisky” in English. However it is known, Scotch Whisky, Scotch or Whisky. Blends are selected from between fifteen and fifty different malt whiskies and three or four grain whiskies.

Each is at a different age (by law, they must be at least three years old; some may be twenty–five in even a standard blend), and is chosen from an individual cask. If the blend bears an age statement, all of the whiskies must have been matured for at least that length of time before they are blended.

Cordials & Liqueurs

A cordial or liqueur is a spirituous liquor flavoured with various aromatic substances, usually sweetened, and often brandy-based. Liqueurs are usually made by steeping the flavouring material in the spirit.” Knowing that they are often brandy-based, it is useful to know that brandy is distilled from wine. As identified, cordials and liqueurs are usually made by adding some flavour to alcohol, via an infusion.
